START OF 2025 - KEY EVENTS & PROGRAMMES IN TERM 1

WELCOME BACK AND GREETINGS FOR 2025

- 1. To begin the new academic year, let me first congratulate the new Secondary 1 students for securing a place in Crest Secondary School. We trust that our Secondary 2 to 4 Crestans have made good use of the vacation and are looking forward to another exciting year of growth.
- 2. I would like to share that our Vice-Principal (Academic), Mr David Chan, has been posted to Bukit Batok Secondary School with effect from 15 December 2024. He has played a pivotal role in leading the various academic and student development programmes in the school. We thanked Mr Chan for his dedicated service and contributions over the last six years. In place of Mr David Chan, I am pleased to announce that Mr Othman Arsan Mohd Abubakar, our previous Dean of Student Development, is now appointed as Vice-Principal (Academic) with effect from 1 January 2025. The current school leaders, together with Mr Othman, look forward to working closely with you and your child/ward to ensure that Crest Secondary continues to be a place for your child to learn and grow.
- 3. We are pleased to share that our 9th batch of Crestans from the Class of 2024 have performed well for the GCE N-Level Examination and the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC) courses. 96.2% of our 156 graduating students were awarded the GCE N(T) Certificate while 96.1% were awarded the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC). In addition, 59.2% of our students have secured a place in a course of their choice at ITE through the Early Admission Exercise. We wish the Class of 2024 all the best in ITE, and like many of their seniors, progress to diploma courses at ITE/Polytechnics in the years ahead.
- 4. We congratulate the 161 new Secondary 1 students who secured a place in Crest Secondary School. We would also like to welcome our Secondary 2 to 4 Crestans back to another exciting year of learning and growth.
- 5. For 2025, we can look forward to activities planned for all students, so that the value proposition of a unique education path in Crest can be fully experienced by all Crestans. A list of these key events and programmes in Term 1 is shared in **Annex A**. Details of other major events and programmes are also shared in the rest of this letter.

ENHANCING INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

- 9. As part of our ongoing commitment to providing a conducive learning environment for our students, the school has embarked on a significant project to upgrade some of the school's facilities and infrastructure. Since the start of the Nov/Dec school holidays in 2023, the school commenced the upgrading of the school canteen, cafe, Student Hub, parade square, multipurpose hall, and foyer areas. While some of these works will continue into the upcoming school term, rest assured that the school, together with the upgrading project personnel and contractor specialist teams, has implemented necessary measures to minimize any impact to the functional use of these spaces. Where necessary, localised hoarding/temporary protection will be erected to ensure the safety and security of our students and staff.
- 10. Throughout this upgrading period, we seek the support and understanding of our various stakeholders. The school is actively working to minimise inconveniences for our students, which may include occasional construction noise. We believe these enhancements will not only enrich our students' educational experience but also contribute to creating a more inviting and stimulating environment.

STUDENT MATTERS

START RIGHT PROGRAMME 2025

- 11. The Start Right Programme is a special transition programme for our Crestans that will be conducted on 2 January 2025, Thursday, 3 January 2025, Friday and 6 January 2025, Monday (Weeks 0 and 1). During the Start Right Week, students will be eased back to school routines and expectations after a long break, with teachers checking in on their well-being. The reporting time will follow the regular schedule at 7:45 am. The dismissal time for the Start Right Week for all levels will be at 12:15 pm.
- 12. The regular curriculum will commence on 7 January 2025, Tuesday. All students will be dismissed according to their respective class timetables.
- 13. As part of our school's continuing efforts to stay connected and strengthen school-family relationships, Form Teachers will make home visits to engage parents/guardians during the Start Right Week as well as throughout the year. We hope to work very closely with you in the best interest of your child/ward, and we look forward to your support when our Form Teachers take their time to visit you.

TEMPERATURE-TAKING EXERCISE

14. Term 1 temperature-taking exercise will be held on 15 January 2025, Wednesday. This exercise aims to ensure that the school is prepared to activate the temperature-taking regime promptly if the need arises, and to educate students on taking responsibility for their own health. All Sec 2 to 4 students are to bring their Oral Digital Thermometers (ODT) on 13 January 2025, Monday, for serviceability check by their Form Teachers. All Secondary 1 students will be issued a new thermometer by the school by 13 January 2025, Monday.

KEEP RIGHT! WEEK (TERM 1 WK 7)

15. In Term 1, Week 7 (17–21 February 2025), our Crest students will embark on the Keep Right! Programme. - 18. All students are required to participate in one Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) as part of their holistic development. Crest offers a total of 13 CCAs 5 Sports, 3 Visual and Performing Arts, 1 Uniformed Group and 4 Clubs. To give our Secondary 1 and new transfer-in students a better understanding of the CCAs, a CCA Exposure Programme will be conducted on 10 January 2025 and 17 January 2025, Fridays, where students will learn about the different CCAs.
- 19. The Sports CCAs and Dance will be having selection trials on the following dates. Secondary 1 students who are interested in participating in these CCAs **must** go for the sports selection trials.

CHINESE NEW YEAR (CNY) CELEBRATIONS

22. The 2025 CNY festive holidays will fall on 29 January 2025, Wednesday and 30 January 2025, Thursday. The school will be celebrating CNY on **28 January 2025, Tuesday**. Students will report to school at 7:45am and will be dismissed at 10:30am. We encourage students to don either Chinese ethnic costumes or red tops to enhance the festive mood. School will resume on 31 January 2025, Friday.

HEALTHY MEALS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAMME (HMSP) AND CONSUMPTION OF WATER

- 23. To support our students' health development, the school is on board the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) by the Health Promotion Board (HPB). This programme provides food service guidelines for school canteens and aims to cultivate good eating habits among our students, so that they will be accustomed to consuming fruit, vegetables, and whole grains as part of their daily diet. All prices of the set meals, sides, snacks, and drinks are clearly displayed at the canteen stalls. Healthy set meals will be provided in the school canteen with prices ranging from \$3.00 to \$4.00. We seek your support to encourage your child/ward to eat healthily.
- 24. We also encourage our students to consume water on a regular basis throughout the day as our weather is hot and humid. As proper hydration is important, we strongly encourage all students to bring **their own water bottle** to school. There are many water coolers around the school where students can fill up their water bottles.

Please note that teachers are not obliged to share their personal phone numbers with parents or students. Parents may wish to discuss with your child's teachers their preferred mode of communication.

SCHOOL SMART CARDS (SSCs) FOR SECONDARY 1 STUDENTS

30. The school will be distributing School Smart Cards (SSCs) to new Secondary 1 students by April 2025. Meanwhile, Secondary 1 students can continue to use their primary level SSCs for concessionary travel at the secondary school rate until 30 April 2025, Wednesday.

PHOTO-TAKING FOR STUDENTS

31. The school will be arranging for photographs of students to be taken in Term 1. Students are required to be attired neatly in school uniform, with proper haircut, for the photo-taking session. Details will be provided at a later date.

BANK ACCOUNT FOR SECONDARY 3 STUDENTS

32. The Secondary 3 students will participate in their Industry Experiential Programme from mid-October to mid-November this year. Each Sec 3 student is required to have a valid bank account in their name, which can also be a joint account with their parents. The school will request the submission of bank details and other necessary documents at the end of Term 1.

Non-Singaporean students are requested to bring their Health Booklet and immunisation certificates (if any), to the health check-up.

NRIC REGISTRATION EXERCISE

35. The annual NRIC registration exercise will be conducted in school on **14 February 2025**, **Friday**. Personnel from ICA will process the registration for all Secondary 3 students, together with selected students from other levels. More details will be provided in due course.

SCHOOL AND MISCELLANEOUS FEES

36. The Association of Banks in Singapore (ABS) has launched a nationwide eGIRO service that fully digitises the current paper-based GIRO process. The eGIRO service will process applications efficiently and securely within minutes, enabling you to set up your GIRO instructions in real time. The School would like to encourage all parents to sign up for eGIRO for the payment of school fees and miscellaneous fees.
