Dear Parents/Guardians,

START OF 2026 – KEY EVENTS & PROGRAMMES IN TERM 1

WELCOME BACK AND GREETINGS FOR 2026

1. To begin the new academic year, let me first congratulate the new Secondary 1 students for securing a place in Crest Secondary School. We also trust that our Secondary 2 to 4 Crestans have made good use of the vacation and are looking forward to another exciting year of growth.
2. I would like to share that our Vice-Principal (Vocational), Mr Teh Tuan Ann, has returned to ITE with effect from 1 January 2026, following the completion of his secondment. Throughout his tenure, Mr Teh played a pivotal role in leading our vocational curriculum development and strengthening industry partnerships. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Mr Teh for his dedicated service and invaluable contributions over the past three years. I am delighted to announce that Mrs Celine Wong, former Vice-Principal of Hua Yi Secondary School, has joined us as Vice-Principal with effect from 15 December 2025. Mrs Wong brings with her a wealth of experience that will greatly benefit our school community. The current school leadership team, together with Mrs Wong, looks forward to working closely with you and your child/ward to ensure that Crest Secondary continues to be a nurturing environment where every student can learn, grow, and thrive.
3. We are pleased to share that our 10th batch of Crestans from the Class of 2025 have performed well in the GCE N-Level Examination and the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC) courses. 98.2% of our 169 graduating students were awarded the GCE N(T) Certificate while 96.9% were awarded the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC). In addition, 72.8% of our students have secured a place in a course of their choice at ITE through the Early Admission Exercise. We wish the Class of 2025 all the best in ITE, and like many of their seniors, progress to diploma courses at ITE/Polytechnics in the years ahead.
4. For 2026, we can look forward to activities planned for all students, so that the value proposition of a unique education path in Crest can be fully experienced by all Crestans. STUDENT MATTERS

START RIGHT PROGRAMME 2026

8. The Start Right Programme is a special transition programme for our Crestans that will be conducted on **2 Jan (Friday), 5 Jan (Monday) and 6 Jan (Tuesday)**. During the Start Right Week, students will be eased back to school routines and expectations after a long break, with teachers checking in on their well-being. The reporting time will follow the regular schedule at **7:45 am**. The dismissal time for the Start Right Week for all levels will be at **12.30 pm (on 2 Jan) and 12.15 pm (on 5 and 6 Jan)**.
9. Regular curriculum will commence on 7 Jan (Wednesday) onwards. All students will be dismissed according to their respective class timetables.
10. As part of our school's continuing efforts to stay connected and strengthen school-family relationships, Form Teachers will make home visits to engage parents/guardians during the Start Right Week, as well as throughout the year. We hope to work very closely with you in the best interest of your child/ward, and we look forward to your support when our Form Teachers take their time to visit you.

UPDATES ON SCHOOL DISCIPLINE POLICIES FOR 2026

11. As we begin the new academic year, we would like to share some updates to our school discipline policies. These refinements are part of our ongoing efforts to support our students' well-being, encourage positive behaviour, and create a safe and focused learning environment where every child can thrive. We value your partnership and greatly appreciate your continued support.

a) GUIDELINES ON THE USE OF SMART DEVICE

In line with the Ministry of Education's updated guidelines (as highlighted in Channel NewsAsia on 30 November 2025), students will not be allowed to use smartphones and smartwatches during school hours. This includes lesson time, recess, CCAs, as well as supplementary, enrichment or remedial programmes.

During school hours, smart devices should be kept in students' school bags or designated storage areas. The school may, however, allow the use of smartphones by exception when necessary and in a designated area (6 round tables in canteen) after school. These measures aim to help students stay focused on learning, build healthy digital habits, and enjoy meaningful interactions with their peers.

b) FOSTERING A BULLY-FREE ENVIRONMENT

The school remains committed to providing a safe and caring environment for every student and we have clear guidance on expectations, reporting channels and follow-up support. We believe in addressing such incidents promptly while guiding students to learn empathy, responsibility and respect for others. c) CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENCES AND CONSEQUENCES

To better support students' learning and growth, offences will be further classified, with corresponding consequences explained. This helps students understand expectations, take responsibility for their actions, and learn important life lessons in a fair and structured manner.

Students will be briefed on the updated guidelines for smart device use and bullying during the first two weeks of school, so that expectations are clearly understood from the start of the year. More detailed and finalised information on all discipline-related policies will be shared with parents via the online Student Handbook in due course.

We thank you sincerely for your understanding, trust and partnership as we work together to guide our students in their holistic development.

REMINDER ON SCHOOL DECORUM - ATTIRE AND GROOMING

12. As we begin a new year of 2026, we would like to remind you of our school's grooming standards to ensure all students maintain a neat and appropriate appearance. Please take a moment to review your child's uniform, hair length and style, nail care, accessories and overall presentation before they return to school.
13. We will be conducting a check on students' attire and grooming during the first week of the term. Students who do not meet the established grooming guidelines will be asked to rectify their appearance within a stipulated period. A second check will then be conducted in the subsequent week to ensure compliance. Should students still not meet the established grooming guidelines after the second check, they will be asked to rectify their appearance before attending classes.

INDUSTRY EXPERIENTIAL PROGRAMME 2026

Students are required to apply for a bank account by the end of Term 1. Bank details will need to be submitted in Term 2. Further details will be shared at a later date.

SCHOOL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EXERCISE

17. To ensure the school community remains prepared for emergencies, the school will conduct a fire drill in January. During the evacuation, all students and staff will proceed to the designated internal assembly area following established safety protocols. Trained staff members will be positioned throughout the building to guide students along evacuation routes and monitor their safety and well-being throughout the exercise.

CHINESE NEW YEAR (CNY) CELEBRATIONS

Students will report to school at 7:45am and will be dismissed at 10:15am. We encourage students to don either Chinese ethnic costumes or red tops to enhance the festive mood.

HEALTHY MEALS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAMME (HMSP) AND CONSUMPTION OF WATER

26. To support our students' health development, the school is on board the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) by the Health Promotion Board (HPB). This programme provides food service guidelines for school canteens and aims to cultivate good eating habits among our students, so that they will be accustomed to consuming fruit, vegetables, and whole grains as part of their daily diet. All prices of the set meals, sides, snacks, and drinks are clearly displayed at the canteen stalls. Healthy set meals will be provided in the school canteen with prices ranging from \$3.00 to \$4.00. We seek your support to encourage your child/ward to eat healthily.
27. We also encourage our students to consume water on a regular basis throughout the day as our weather is hot and humid. As proper hydration is important, we strongly encourage all students to bring **their own water bottle** to school. There are many water coolers around the school where students can fill up their water bottles.

LOCKER FACILITY

28. Students who wish to utilise the locker facility are to provide their own number combination lock. Students are reminded that it is their responsibility to remember the number combination for their locks at all times.

UPDATING STUDENT'S ABSENCE VIA PARENT'S GATEWAY

34. SCHOOL SMART CARDS (SSCs) FOR SECONDARY 1 STUDENTS

35. The school will be distributing School Smart Cards (SSCs) to new Secondary 1 students by **end February 2026**. Meanwhile, Secondary 1 students can continue to use their primary level SSCs for concessionary travel at the secondary school rate until end April 2026. Students can still purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their Primary level SSCs, but they would need to purchase the BCP for Secondary School students.

PHOTO-TAKING FOR STUDENTS
