Expanding programmes to cater to students' needs

support unit as one-third of its students have dyslexia, a learning difficulty that affects reading and spell-

Ms Rebekah Ong, subject head of the learning support unit, said some of the students had a reading level similar to that of Primary 2 pupils.

As the number of students who need help is large, the school has ramped up its literacy programme, providing different tiers of help, ranging from using a technologyassisted reading programme to partnering the Dyslexia Association of Singapore to run a literacy programme in the school.

Mr Tan said he roped in volun teers to conduct a weekly reading

He said: "We may not bridge the gap completely or we may see only a small improvement, but not doing anything isn't an option because the child would not be learning or understanding what he is taught otherwise."

For students who struggle the most with reading, they are given individual or small group classes to ensure they get the help they need.

"If students have a reading level of P2, it means that no matter how much you apply differentiated instruction, there are limits to how much you can help them in a class,"

"We realised that parents of kids with special educational needs just want to make sure their kids grow up with confidence. All they are asking is that their kids grow up with wood self-esteem and feel loved. It's




### Student Support

## **Special Education Needs Officer (SENO)**

Renders support to students with relatively higher special educational needs. Works with student and family towards **independence** 





## **School Counsellor** (SC)

Renders support to students/families with long-term school absenteeism, issues of safety (home) & school reintegration







#### Support for a few students

- Customised, targeted intervention of programmes

### **Access Arrangements (AA)**

- Lower secondary allow all students to attempt the year end exams without AA
- Exceptions based on strong recommendation by Subject teachers and SENOs.

**Personalised Digital** Learning Programme (PDLP) Home-Based Learning (HBL)

#### What is PDLP?

It is a national initiative where all secondary school students can learn effectively through ICT activities, with the use of digital device.

#### Why PDLP?

More effective learning with digital tools.

ICT can help students to:

- 1. Visualise concepts (videos, AR)
- 2. Research and make sense of data
- 3. Promote self-paced learning (online guides with videos)
- 4. Gamification of lessons.

This list is **not** exhaustive.

#### What is the laptop chosen?



Acer TMP214-53 (Cost: \$833.70)

This laptop is chosen for the following reasons:

- 1. It is a Windows laptop as some software used in Vocational subjects are only available in Windows OS.
- 2. The specifications have at least i5 Intel processor chip, 8GB RAM and SSD. This will allow for Device Management App (DMA) to run in the background without experiencing slow-down in performance for students.

#### What is the funding like for the laptop?

#### Singaporean students not in FAS

- Full cost of the laptop can be deducted from Edusave Pupil Fund (permission required).
- If edusave fund is insufficient, cash payment will be needed for the remaining amount.

#### Singaporean students in FAS

- Full cost of the laptop can be deducted from Edusave Pupil Fund (permission required).
- If edusave fund is insufficient, there will be further grants, with payment of maximum \$50 in cash.

#### **Permanent Residents/International Students**

- Full cost of laptop to be paid for in cash.
- Subsidies only provided for selected households with Gross Household Income below a certain level.

#### **Device Management Application (DMA)**

- It is a software installed in the laptop that allows teachers and parents to control usage of laptop and what online sites can be visited.
- This is helpful to ensure teaching and learning is not being distracted during lesson time in class.
- More details about DMA will be provided by MOE in due course.

#### **Top 3 Commonly Asked Questions**

**Question**: Can my child use the laptop that he has at home for lessons in school, without buying through the PDLP?

#### Answer:

Yes, you can. But do take note of the following:

- 1. No transfer of funds or subsidies to you.
- 2. Hard disk in laptop will be wiped clean for a fresh installation with DMA included.
- 3. DMA will only be uninstalled upon graduation from our school.
- 4. Laptop must be a Windows OS laptop and preferably with a minimum of i5 Intel processor chip with 8GB RAM and 256GB SSD.

#### **Top 3 Commonly Asked Questions**

**Question**: What happens if my child's laptop is faulty?

#### Answer:

If the laptop is not bought through PDLP, you will need to bring the laptop for repair on your own.

If the laptop is bought through PDLP, the child can leave the laptop with the school. The vendor will be collecting faulty laptops for repair from school. However, do take note that though there are 3 years warranty and insurance, damage due to personal negligence might result in cash payment on your side.

#### **Top 3 Commonly Asked Questions**

Question: Can my child bring the laptop home?

#### Answer:

Definitely, the laptop belongs to your child. Actually, the school will require them to bring their laptops home. This will allow them to do their online homework or research at home.

On a further note, every child is expected to charge their laptop at home the night before, so that it is ready for use in school the next day.

#### What is Home-Based Learning (HBL)?

- HBL is another school day but students will do their learning at home.
- HBL allows students to practise independent learning, show responsibility and diligence to ensure work is done for the day.
- Students will have a mixture of 'live' Zoom lessons, online and offline work. The pieces of work needed to be done will be shown to students on the HBL day itself.
- Dates for the entire year's HBL days will be put up in Crestan's Virtual Assistant (C-VA) website.
- All information about HBL can be found in C-VA, including the work needed to be done by students. Link to C-VA will
  be shown in the next slide. It can also be found in school website.
